Internship details

Location	Al-Nayzak Office in Jerusalem
	Option 1 - Fall: Embark on an enriching three to four- month journey between September and December, leading courses in English, Critical & Design Thinking, or, if inclined, extending valuable college counseling services to Horizons students.
	Option 2 - Winter: Immerse yourself in a focused two- week period between December and January, dedicated to instructing English or, alternatively, providing thoughtful college counseling to Horizons students.
	Option 3 - Spring: Engage in a dynamic four to six-week interval between April and May, committed to teaching English, nurturing creative writing skills, guiding students through SAT and TOEFL preparations, or, at the candidate's discretion, offering comprehensive college counseling to Horizons students.
Duration	Option 4 - Summer: Immerse yourself in a vibrant four to six-week period spanning May to July, dedicated to supporting the team in preparing for the summer school and taking on a role as an instructor for one of the courses listed in the table below. It's important to note that counseling is optional.
	Option 5 - Year-round: Explore diverse opportunities as the type of work remains to be determined (TBD) through collaborative discussions with candidates. This approach allows for flexibility, enabling individuals to tailor their roles based on their unique expertise and interests.
	*Note: The college counseling aspect encompasses one-on- one mentoring, support with college applications, assistance with essay reviews, and guidance on various aspects of professional development, such as resume preparation and internship searches.

Eligibility criteria

Academic Background

- Undergraduate students must be enrolled in a recognized accredited institution, pursuing a relevant degree program.
- Graduate students must have successfully completed an undergraduate degree from a recognized accredited institution.
- Professionals looking for a change of career or a new adventure should have a minimum of a bachelor's degree, in any field.

Field of Study

- For Summer School Teaching: Eligible candidates should have a background in education, child development, or a related field to the subject they are teaching. Previous coursework or experience in teaching is highly desirable.
- For English Teaching: Proficiency in English is required, and candidates should have a strong academic background or relevant coursework in English, linguistics, or a related field.
- For Unique Interventions: Eligible candidates should have a background in computer science, robotics, or a related STEM field.

Age Requirement

• All applicants must be at least 18 years old.

Communication Skills

 Strong communication skills in English are essential for all internship positions. Proficiency in additional languages may be advantageous for English Teaching positions.

Legal Requirements

 International candidates must possess the necessary legal documentation to work in the host country. Horizons Academy will not sponsor visas for international interns.

Motivation and Passion

 Horizons Academy values candidates who are passionate about education, community development, and making a positive impact on the lives of students.

Professionalism

 Interns are expected to maintain a high level of professionalism, adhere to the academy's code of conduct, and respect the diverse cultural backgrounds of students and colleagues.

Arrival information



Language

Arabic and Hebrew are the official languages in Jerusalem. English is taught in local schools, though proficiency levels among the local population may vary.



Climate

Jerusalem is situated 60 kilometers inland and at altitudes of 760 to 900 meters above sea level, and experiences a dry climate. Summer temperatures are in the general range of 27° (celsius), while winters tend to be in the range of 11° (celsius).



Arrival

Most visitors arrive by air at Ben Gurion Airport, approximately 45 kilometers northwest of Jerusalem.



Electric Utilities

Modern local electrical outlets are compatible with European two-point and three-point plug standards (similar to Canadian plugs but with different point shapes). Some older homes may have UK, US, or European fittings.



Banking

East Jerusalem primarily relies on cash transactions, whereas credit cards are more widely accepted in West Jerusalem. ATMs are readily available in Jerusalem.

The primary currency is the New Israeli Shekel (NIS), divided into 100 agorot (singular, agora).

Q&A

Is Jerusalem safe?

By and large, yes – and especially so in the areas that our interns will be located. Interns will be in a tourist-oriented city. Interns and students will be residing in a safe apartment in Jerusalem. Most likely, your time there will be uneventful and the biggest danger you'll expose yourself to is a traffic accident. Interns will mostly be at the educational facility, and partake in supervised tours, if Horizons team deems it safe to do so. As always when traveling, be alert and use common sense. Always travel somewhere with a buddy and let the larger group know where you will be.

What precautions does Horizons take for the intern's safety?

Horizons collectively has experience bringing hundreds of international visitors into Jerusalem. Horizons will provide transportation to and from Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion Airport at scheduled times.

During and after the program, our local staff will take you on cultural excursions in the country as a group.

How do I enter the country?

Interns will fly into Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion Airport, where you may be asked security questions. All interns will be provided a formal invitation letter from Horizons Academy to present to border security upon arrival.

Many nationalities, including US, Canadian, and EU passport holders, can fly into Tel Aviv and obtain a 90-day tourist visa upon arrival for free. Other nationalities may need to apply (e.g., China, India) for a visa to Israel. Volunteers must fly into Tel Aviv and should not fly into Amman, Jordan nor use a land crossing to enter Israel unless pre-cleared by Horizons.






